### What is this product?

### **Type**

- This product is a class of units of the Sub-Fund and is denominated in EUR. The Fund is an open-ended undertaking for collective investment (Fonds Commun de Placement or "FCP") and qualifies as an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS"), subject to Part I of the Luxembourg law of 17 December 2010 relating to Undertakings for Collective Investment ("Investment Fund Law"), transposing Directive 2009/65/EC related to UCITS.
- As an investment fund, the return of the Sub-Fund depends on the performance of its underlying assets.

### **Objectives**

### Investment objective:

■ The Sub-Fund aims to mainly invest in global bonds issued by public and private bodies with an average maturity not exceeding December 31, 2028 and the maturity of individual holdings not exceeding December 31, 2029. To achieve the management objective, up to 100% of the portfolio may be invested in fixed rate or floating rate bonds, other negotiable debt securities and money market instruments ("MMI") from all economic sectors.

### Investment policy:

- The Sub-Fund may invest: up to 50% in high yield bonds and up to 40% in corporate and government bonds in emerging countries.
- The Sub-Fund may also invest in financial derivative instruments for hedging purpose, for efficient portfolio management and investment. At least 90% of investments in other currencies will be hedged in Euro.
- During the period from the initial date of subscription and until the minimum asset amount under management within the Sub-Fund reaches the level of Euro 50 million, the Sub-Fund may invest in money market securities and government bonds. The December 31, 2028 is defined as the target date of the Sub-Fund (the "Target Date"). From July 1, 2028 once the securities maturity is reached the Sub-Fund might be automatically invested in ancillary liquid assets, MMI, term deposits and bonds with maturity in line with the residual limit of the investment universe. No later than the first quarter of 2029 the Sub-Fund will be merged into a sub-fund of NEF, or if such merger is not economically or otherwise feasible, liquidated.
- The Sub-Fund is actively managed with no reference to a benchmark.
- In accordance with article 7 (1) of SFDR, the principal adverse impacts on sustainability factors are not considered as the investment strategy does not pursue environmental or social characteristics and does not have sustainable investments as its investment objective.

Given the above investment objective and policy and the risk and reward profile of the product, the recommended holding period is 4 years.

**Subscription and Redemption:** Investors can buy or sell units of the Sub-Fund every day which is a bank business day in Luxembourg ("Business Day"). From December 31, 2024, the Sub-Fund will be closed to all buys, subscriptions, and switches in (but not to sales, redemptions and switches out which will be subject to a redemption or switching fee) until the Target Date.

**Distribution Policy:** The Sub-Fund aims to pay out a dividend on an annual basis.

### Intended investor

Category D will be available for any kind of investors.

It is aimed at private and institutional investors looking for greater returns, or a higher income than provided by cash holdings or by quality global government bonds, who are willing to accept the risks associated with their investment, and who are prepared to remain invested until the end date.

The minimum subscription is EUR 500.

### Term

This product was incorporated for a defined period until the December 31, 2028. The manufacturer may terminate this product unilaterally or may be automatically merged into a sub-fund of NEF after the maturity date in 2028.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 4 years.



The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we, as the management company acting on behalf of the Fund, are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact the capacity of the Sub-Fund to pay you.

This product is in this category because it invests in a range of assets with different levels of risk and its simulated and/or realised return has experienced a low level rises and falls historically.

Not all risks affecting the Sub-Fund are adequately captured by the summary risk indicator.

This rating does not take into account other risk factors which should be considered before investing, these include: emerging market risk, liquidity risk, financial, economic and political risks, credit risk, use of derivative instruments, high yield bonds risk, interest rate risk and holding of convertible bonds.

### **Performance scenarios**

### What happens if Nord Est Asset Management S.A. is unable to pay out?

### What are the costs?

#### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. We have assumed (i) in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario and (ii)  $\in$  10,000 is invested.

### How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

### Recommended holding period ("RHP"): 4 years

The RHP has been defined by taking into account the above objectives and risk and reward profile. You should be prepared to stay invested for at least 4 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty prior to the end of the RHP, or hold the investment longer. Redemption requests must be received before 2 p.m. Luxembourg time on each Business Day to be dealt with on the basis of the net asset value per unit applicable on that day ("Valuation Day"). Payment for redemptions is expected to be made within 1 week from the Valuation Day. Any cashing-in before the end of the RHP may have a negative consequence on your investment.
